Indiana Department of Education Early Literacy Endorsement Professional Development

Guidelines/Expectations – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Pursuant to IC 20-28-5-19.7 the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) Early Literacy Endorsement Professional Development is available to <u>certified</u> prekindergarten through grade six educators; educators with special education license and administrators serving prekindergarten through six buildings. This may include but is not limited to, the primary classroom teacher, an instructional coach, a reading interventionist (in grades PreK-6), a special education teacher, a Title I teacher, or other certified educators who are responsible for the delivery and implementation of literacy instruction to students in prekindergarten through six grade.

IDOE will pay for the cost of an educator to obtain the Early Literacy Endorsement, including a \$1,200 stipend and the required licensing exam only when professional development is completed through Keys to Literacy. The \$1,200 stipend will be delivered in three incremental payments of \$400 after key milestones have been completed. An educator must successfully COMPLETE the course in its entirety by June 2025. Please check your schedule for live session dates and the coursework requirements for potential conflicts prior to enrolling. The expectations of this course offering are listed below:

- Attend ALL virtual-live meetings for the course.
- First and last sessions must be attended.
- Complete ALL modules in the asynchronous online course.
- Submit ALL independent, asynchronous assignments.
- Complete ALL course requirements within the designated course timeframe.
- Successful completion of the designated assessment.

In the event of an emergency, participants may miss one virtual-live meeting, except the first or last sessions. An <u>absence justification form</u> must be submitted within 24 hours of the emergency absence and the participant will be required to watch the recorded session within the assigned timeframe and submit a signed assurance document to IDOE to confirm the course requirements have been met.

- Participants may NOT join a separate cohort in order to make up an absence from their assigned session.
- If you are more than 15 minutes late, or you must exit more than 15 minutes early, you must fill out an <u>absence justification form</u> on the day of the event
